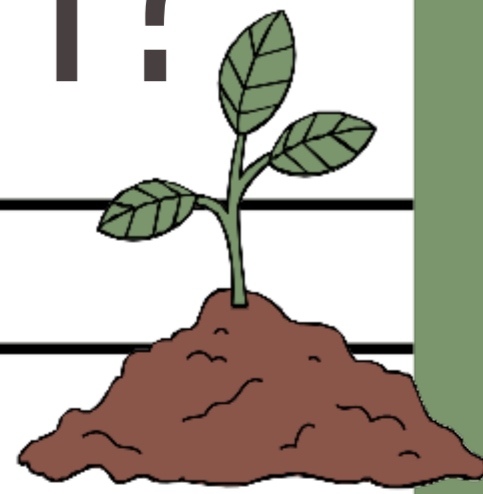

Fostering Inclusion and Belonging at SPPH

At SPPH, REDI encompasses activities that promote an inclusive and respectful community grounded in a sense of safety and belonging for everyone in learning, workplace and research environments. It includes initiatives to create a more diverse and vibrant SPPH community and greater equity for students, staff and faculty.

Taking Action

REDI actions can include making changes to SPPH structures, policies, and organizational processes, to training and workshops, and to education and curriculum reforms.

Who Leads REDI at SPPH
